#### Fine & Performing Arts:

Proposals: Reconfigure the Gen Ed Aesthetic Literacy requirement.

- 1. Motion made by Dave Wegley, seconded by Mark Brown to Delete FNAR 1103: Intro to Fine Arts course offerings and from the general education Aesthetic Literacy requirement.
  - Concerns were the need to hire more adjuncts to teach the additional courses.
  - Would this pull students out of existing courses to be split into new courses?
  - Would students still get exposure to other areas if they have to choose one of the other 3 options?
  - If the perception is that the course is being discontinued due to teaching methods, etc. and the retirement of the current Professor are those valid reasons?

Motion carried with Elizabeth George opposing.

- 2. Motion made by Mark Brown, seconded by Scott Koeneman to Replace FNAR 1103: *Intro to FA* with 3 options
  - a. FNAR 1303: Exploring Art
  - b. FNAR 1403: Exploring Theater
  - c. FNAR 1503: Exploring Music
  - Discussion centered around what the impact on the existing gen ed courses would be. Can a student take two of these and none of the "bottom" level aesthetic literacy courses?
  - What is the breadth/depth of these courses in relation to the existing course? Would students get enough to meet the outcome?
  - Discussion about instructors and class sizes. There would be no change in the number of sections overall per year.
